N. Vizcaya, KneoWorld PH team up on new tech for SPED

The new program called the Assistive Technologies for Special Education Project is joining together the provincial government

with a consortium of local corporations led by Vizcaya Bank, KneoWorld Philippines, and its parent organization, KneoMedia, Ltd., as well as the Schools Division of Nueva Vizcaya, and Solano East Central School and SPED Center.

In addition, Junie Fajardo, president of the Rotary Club of Quezon City has also announced a similar educational program to support students enrolled in Batino Elementary School and SPED Center in Quezon City as part of the Rotary Club's long established support effort designed to assist and advance education in countries throughout the world.

Fajardo also noted that the special project in Quezon City is designed to help children and "provide a way for us to expand the program to other schools in

Quezon City."

"We hope to inspire Rotary Clubs throughout the Philippines to take a leadership role in introducing new learning technologies such as KneoWorld teaching software to support and advance all special needs students and unlock their individual potential," he said.
